[Rwyf](#) wedi herio'r [Gweinidog Addysg](#) ynghylch sut mae'n bwriadu cael sicrwydd ansawdd mewn Addysg Uwch os dilëir corff yr Asiantaeth Sicrhau Ansawdd.

Mae'n amlwg fod y Gweinidog wedi methu â gweithredu i amddiffyn ansawdd darpariaeth prifysgolion Cymru.

Mae'r Bil Addysg Uwch yn gwneud peth darpariaeth i gynnal ansawdd dysgu yn ein prifysgolion, ond nid yw'n ddigon.

Ymddengys bod y Gweinidog wedi ei ddal yn ddiarwybod gan benderfyniad y corff cyllido addysg Seisnig i roi masnachfaint yr Asiantaeth Sicrhau Ansawdd allan, ac o ganlyniad, nid yw wedi gwneud unrhyw ddarpariaeth am effaith hyn ar Gymru.

Yng Nghymru, gallai'r penderfyniad hwn arwain at breifateiddio'r corff Sicrhau Ansawdd, gan agor ein systemau addysg i fwy o farchnadeiddio a pheryglu safonau.

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Education Questions

I challenged the [Education Minister](#) over how he intends to deliver quality assurance in the Higher Education sector if the Quality Assurance Agency body is scrapped.

It's clear that the Minister has failed to take action to protect quality of provision in Welsh universities.

The Higher Education Bill does make some provisions to maintain the quality of teaching in our universities, but it is not enough.

It seems that the Minister has been caught off guard by the decision of the English education funding body to franchise the Quality Assurance Agency, and as a result he has made no provision for the impact of this on Wales.

In Wales, this decision could mean that the Quality Assurance body could become privatised, opening up our education systems to further marketisation and could jeopardise standards.

It is astonishing that the Minister and Welsh Government do not seem to have a view on this threat to our university standards and our international reputation.

The Welsh Government should take action now to review quality assurance

procedures and ensure that Welsh universities live up to their excellent reputations.

Social Mobility and Child Poverty Commission Report

Higher Education (Wales) Bill

We have had a debate on the [General Principles of the Higher Education \(Wales\) Bill](#).

The Bill must state the autonomy of universities.

The second part of the Bill that still causes me some confusion is how the Bill will improve or at least maintain the quality assurance within the sector.

The final thing that is needed, as has already been recommended by the committee, is that we see the draft regulations for the fee and access plans. Personally, I would like to see the financial code also in draft form so that we can work with the sector to make sure that everything is properly in place.

Budget

I have pressed the [Welsh Education Minister](#) in the Senedd chamber over his failure to protect the education and skills budget from in-year cuts.

The Education Minister has not defended the education budget from in-year cuts announced over the summer recess.

Children in Welsh schools are paying the price for the failures of the local health boards to manage their budgets as money is being taken this year from schools and apprenticeships to fill a black hole in health spending.

Forward Look

During the party's annual conference we will be debating various policy motions on education. I'm pleased to be taking part in a panel discussing the devolution of pay and conditions of school teachers in Wales. The fringe meeting has been organised by teachers' trade union UCAC.

In the Senedd the week after next there is a statement by the Minister for Education and Skills on Qualifications Reform.
